A SIGNIFICANT DAY

"And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were" (Acts 2:2). The Holy Spirit's arrival on that first Pentecost was signaled by a rush of wind. We all know what it's like when our windows are open just as a summer storm rises up. Curtains fly, papers become airborne, house plants shudder, dust is scattered. A rush of wind disrupts the orderliness of our home. 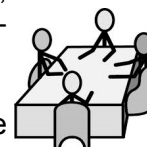

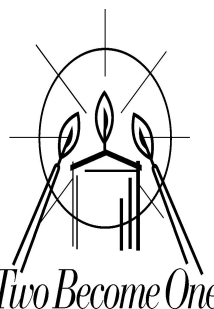

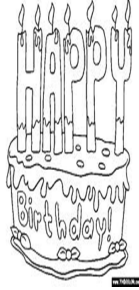

Saints and Special Observances

Monday: St. Bede the Venerable - Was an English monk at the monastery of Saint Peter at Monkwearmouth. He is well known as an author and scholar, and his most famous work, *Historia ecclesiastica gentis Anglorum (The Ecclesiastical History of the English People)* gained him the title "The Father of English History".
St. Gregory VII - Gregory's papal letters stress the role of bishop of Rome as the vicar of Christ and the visible center of unity in the Church. He is well known for his long dispute with Holy Roman Emperor Henry IV over who should control the selection of bishops and abbots. He fiercely resisted any attack on the liberty of the Church. For this he suffered and finally died in exile.
St. Mary Magdalene de'Pazzi - After her profession, she was subject to an extraordinary daily ecstasy for forty consecutive days, at the end of which time she appeared at the point of death. She recovered, however, miraculously; and henceforth, in spite of constant bad health, was able to fill with energy the various offices to which she was appointed.
Tuesday: St. Philip Neri - Except for the hours he devoted to his pupils, Philip seems to have passed his first two years at Rome as a recluse, spending much time in prayer in his bare, uncomfortable attic. He ate frugal meals of bread, water, . It was a period of intense preparation, and at its close he emerged from obscurity with his spirit strengthened, his resolve to live for God confirmed. For three years he worked so hard that he was considered an unusually promising scholar. Then, quite suddenly, moved by some inner prompting, he put an end to classes and studying, sold most of his books, and launched on a mission to the people of Rome
Wednesday: St. Augustine of Canterbury - Augustine of Canterbury was a Benedictine monk who became the first Archbishop of Canterbury in the year 597. He is considered the "Apostle to the English" and a founder of the English Church.
